# **Nothing Except a Staff**

Why only a staff? I've often wondered this. Why, when Jesus sends out the Twelve on their journey, does he instruct them not to take any food, extra clothing, possessions or money—only a staff.

I'd have to say, when all my elderly relatives and friends have come to the point of needing a walking aid, they've fought it tooth and nail. My auntie Hilda only used her Zimmer frame to dry her washing, my dad used to hide his stick under the bed, and uncle Arthur wouldn't be seen dead with the expensive walking cane we got for him! I suppose that speaks volumes about the instruction of the Lord Jesus, doesn't it?

It's all about vulnerability, the staff—and we avoid vulnerability like the plague. Last week, we listened to those wonderful words from St Paul: "I shall be very happy to make my weaknesses my special boast ... for when I am weak then I am strong." We listen, but do we really hear?

Today, Jesus reiterates to the founders of our faith, and to us, that weakness and vulnerability are key to the Christian's journey through life. There is no security in possessions, money, clothing or food. Our only security is the constant reminder that we are dependent on each other and on God - for everything. The only way to go is the way of weakness ... then we will be strong.

Jesus tells us in another place that he is the Way, the Truth and the Life. And in his way of vulnerability—if we'll risk it—we'll find all three: the truth about ourselves, a way forward, and God's life in us.

It's for this reason that he sends his people out in twos. A popular reading at marriages, these days, is from the Wisdom of Qoheleth: "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labour: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up."

And that truth—is the truth that Jesus gives to the Twelve: the secret of the foundation of the Church, the way that we make the Body of Christ in the world. Through our vulnerability to each other, our reliance on our brothers and sisters and on God—we and drawn together to make present the poor, vulnerable face of Christ and to show where strength of true life lies.

So by way of our vulnerability, the Church becomes that body against which the gates of the underworld cannot prevail. When we accept the truth about ourselves and rely on each other and on God—we have authority over the unclean spirits that bring division and lies. Then, we find a way that brings peace on the house of the Church and on our houses: a way that brings life. That's why, for our journey, we need nothing except a staff.
